Ring Toss – A Homemade Version

Hildegard walked home from Washington School along Second Street. A family named Shook lived in a home at the very north end of the street just before it reached Allman. Mr. Shook worked for the railroad and the family had children in high school. Apparently, Mrs. Shook was discarding some of her children's old toys because one day she called to Hildegard as she passed the house. She gave her the ring toss game. The game has been in the Kuse family since about 1938.

Game Rules

Players stand behind a marked line and take turns tossing the rings at the stake.

Score can be determined by the number of rings or the number and the color of rings that circle the stake.

A homemade version of Ring Toss was made by nailing part of a Buckthorn trunk to a board and bending twigs or vines to make rings.
